CONSERVATIONISTS OF THE YEAR



Charles and Dianna Colman of Williams Bay have a deep personal commitment to the environment. Charles has held leadership roles with Geneva Lake Conservancy, Friends of Kishwauketoe Nature Conservancy, and the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission. Experience 5.9 miles of the Ice Age National Scenic Trail in Marathon County. Breathe in the scents of hardwood and cedar forests, explore lowlands and spring pools. Hike, run the trail, or take a stroll and watch the birds and wildlife.







Explore the Yawkey Forest Reserve* Hazelhurst

Protected by: Northwoods Land Trust

Paddle and explore the natural shoreline of Lake Katherine as seen on Discover Wisconsin. Stop for a picnic on Tigertail Point. For more adventure, make it a weekend and hike or bike the nearby Bearskin Trail.

You'll also find plenty of native prairie plants, an oak savanna, and an old-growth forest on the property.

Take in the scenic views of **Sugar Creek Bluff State Park**

Enjoy the bluffs rising from the banks of Sugar Creek, near the Mississippi River in Crawford County. In summer, the 440-acre preserve is open for hiking, wildlife observation, and fishing.



Explore Kangaroo Lake **Nature Preserve***

Enjoy a self-guided tour of a hidden gem in Door County. Feel the temperature changes as you hike through the boreal forest, cedar swamp land, and upland hardwood forest. Use the Seek or iNaturalist app to identify mushrooms and plants that you see along the way. Look for fossils in the rock outcroppings beside the lake.
